As a leader of the trans community in my town, I've seen a great many trans people, especially young ones, consider their transition for many years before beginning any social transition. By the time they come out, they do not need 2 years of experience to know that they feel far happier living in their own gender. I have seen time and time again that the hardest time for trans people is the time they are waiting for being able to do what they'd like to do to move forward. Minimising these sorts of bureaucratic technicalities would significantly help the mental wellbeing of our community here.
