- Housing and planning statistics are devolved and decentralised
 - Produced by Devolved Administrations, multiple departments & various arms length bodies
- Office for Statistics Regulation highlighted coherence issues with housing statistics
- Meeting the GSS Strategy "Better Statistics, Better Decisions"



Progress




- Various quality improvements to individual publications
 - First housing conditions survey since 2008 in Wales
 - New methodology for housing projections in England
 - Many more..
- Creation of a guide to housing statistics, an overview of who produces what statistics and a coherence framework.
- Publication of Private Rented Sector statistics article
- Review of harmonisation of homelessness definitions
- Initial steps into creating the Connected Open Government Statistics (COGS) data repository





Housing and Planning Statistics: Framework







Engagement

- User engagement events in Cardiff, London and now Edinburgh
- Consultation with over 140 responses from a broad range of users
- Respondents were interested in a range of different statistics shown in the word cloud:
- There were three key themes for improvement identified:
 - Geography more lower level data
 - Accessibility ease of accessing data
 - Methodology concern about different definitions across producers







Connected Open Government Statistics (COGS)

- Aim to increase the impact and reach of GSS statistical data by improving how we organise, integrate and deliver GSS data online.
- Data Repository of Published data
- Uses Dataset families Housing, Trade, Health
- Tidy Data and Linked Data Machine-ready data that can easily be linked.
- Tools to access and use the data





Next Steps



- We recently published our work programme to cover 2019/2020 and beyond
- Publication of cross-UK analysis of homelessness and affordable housing statistics
- Continue to enhance the accessibility of government housing statistics particularly into machine readable formats
