

GDP grew 0.1% in the fourth quarter of 2022

Gross Domestic Product grew by 0.1% during October to December.

During this period UK GDP remained flat (0.0% change).

Scottish GDP rose by 0.6% over the year


Compared to the same time last year (2021 Q4), Scottish GDP has increased 0.6%.

Equivalent UK change over the year was 0.4%.


Weak growth in Services and Production

In 2022 Q4, output in the Construction sector increased by 0.6%, output in the Production sector increased by 0.2% and Services sector output remained flat at 0.0%.


Change in GDP compared to last quarter

Between 2021 and 2022 (taking all four quarters of each year), Scottish GDP increased by 5.0%.

Equivalent UK change in 2021 was 4.0%.
