public's perspective of residential care (for children and adults) becomes even more negative than it currently is, adding to the trauma of those who will need this kind of provision in the future. A generation ago, older adults had memories of the poorhouse from their childhood, and this influenced their feelings about and ability to accept residential care in their later years. There is also a risk to those who did not experience abuse in care, i.e. a potential for undermining their positive memories and confidence in the care they did experience. Also, an exclusive focus on abusive experiences may further stigmatise residential care as a career/employment option for the past, present and future workforce.
