Comments It is important that the Forum has a clear identity and avoids being associated too closely to another body. At the same time, it seems unlikely that the Forum's staffing levels would be such that a stand-alone body would provide good value for money. The option of a separate unit within another body seems the most practical one. This body should, however, be chosen carefully to avoid perceptions of vested interest and to be clear of negative associations with past events. It seems unlikely that a residential care provider would be suitable.

Comments In principle all adults should be eligible to take part, regardless of the level of support required to assist them in doing so. There are potential logistical and resource difficulties in applying this (e.g. travel from outwith UK or specialised advocacy input), but it may be preferable to deal with these on an individual basis while striving to apply the principle of universal access.

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- Participants should have the opportunity to access a restorative justice process such as that offered in the 'Time To Be Heard' initiative to provide a potential opportunity to receive an apology from the responsible agency, to assist in ensuring similar abuse does not recur and to register with the agency the personal impact on their lives.
- 2. Participants should have the opportunity to access a support organisation that is able to provide support and counselling where appropriate. See Q9 below.
- 3. There should be the opportunity for survivors to tell their story in a way that would reflect their experience sensitively, vividly and in a way that impacted on the consciousness of society in general. Consideration should be given to developing an arts-based initiative to assist survivors to produce a public artwork which articulates the message they would wish to have recorded and passed on to future generations.
