What do you think about the location and size of the proposed South Arran MPA ?	I agree with the location and designation of the possible South Arran MPA. I would prefer if it was extended to all around the Isle of Arran. Seabirds should be included as “marine priority features”
What should the management measures be for the proposed South Arran MPA?	Supervision and overseen by any coastal watch, coastguard, or fishery protection authority. Supported on the water and in the air by patrolling boat and helicopter. Plus landing and vetting supervision of any fishing boats in the area's.
What social and economic effects do you think the South Arran MPA will have?	The economic effect or advantage is not the correct one. The effect is in the restoration and re-growth of natural marine habitats. This could be displayed initially by an undersea marine park, by exhibition of marine growth and life and the demonstration in due course of the fertility of marine life in the area.
Other Comments	Scottish Government has a legal obligation to improve the Clyde to good environmental status. SNH's advice on management of a few specific species and habitats fails to address adequate protection of a failing Clyde ecosystem. Proper ecosystem management is needed. The specification and re- establishment of the Clyde marine ecosystem is a long term objective. Five years at least, then controlled.
