I accept that demolition and construction of buildings will lead to the removal or creation of datazones, but this should be done on a minimalist basis, i.e. existing datazones should continue unchanged until population change forces some adjustment, when it would either be merged with a neighbouring datazone or split up if too large. If the original datazones had any validity as homogeneous entities then they should surely be preserved as such. I can see that the re-definition of output areas for the 2011 Census has created problems for you, but they could have been defined in a way that fitted in the existing datazone boundaries. Civil parishes have been defined in a way that preserves their geographical continuity across censuses, and I think that the same attitude should apply to datazones.
