Comments: As mentioned above there is no significant information on the private water supply to a property even given the serious health problems associated with these systems.

A proforma report should be available detailing:

- (a) the layout of the system (including any pumps and treatment) and other users on the same supply;
- (b) the maintenance requirements of any treatment systems;
- (c) the results from any samples taken in the last five years;
- (d) any grants given for supply improvement and any enforcement action taken by the Local Authority on the supply; and
- (e) any risk assessment undertaken on the supply by the Local Authority.

The last three items are readily available from the public register of private water supplies held by the Local Authority for the area and should be available at little or no additional cost.

The information requested in items (a) and (b) will require some work by the seller but should result in improvement to the supply prior to sale and a much better knowledge of both the system and its treatment, for the purchaser.
