## How does the programme support the rural economy in Scotland?

The purpose of the SRDP 2014 to 2020 is to help achieve sustainable economic growth.

The main priorities are: enhancing the rural economy, supporting agricultural and forestry businesses, protecting and improving the natural environment, addressing the impact of climate change and supporting rural communities.

#### **Forestry Grant Scheme**

Scotland's woodlands and forests are a vital national resource and play an important role in rural development and sustainable land use.

### What have some of the other schemes done?



LEADER has **funded 879 projects** to date, which vary from organising an activity week for young people in Dumfries & Gallaway to a recycling project in Moray.



The Food Processing Marketing & Co-operation Scheme has created and safeguarded 8,245 jobs.



The Knowledge Transfer and Innovation Fund has **trained 14,384 participants**, which is almost the entire population of Troon.



The number of beneficieries that have received advice through the Farm Advisory Service can fill **30 Boeing 747 airplanes**.



The Less Favoured Area Support Scheme continues to support more than 11,000 farmers and crofters.



**894 new farmers** have received support through other schemes for their agricultural business.
