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Housing First Scotland Pathfinder Programme

£9.5 million programme (£6.5 million Scottish Government, £3 million Social Bite & Merchants House) administered by the Corra Foundation

830 Housing First tenancies by 2021 across Aberdeen/shire, Dundee, Edinburgh, Glasgow & Stirling

Tenancies provided by Housing Associations, Local Authorities and Private Landlords

Support delivered by 15 third sector providers through local consortia



Achievements so far ...

156 * tenancies started

93% tenancy sustainment rate

1% repeat homelessness rate

22 people have passed the 1 year milestone in their tenancy, with another 15 due to reach milestone in coming weeks

go days average time for people to move into their home



Learning so far ...

Programme is accelerating ... the more we learn the quicker the pace and greater the momentum

Cross Sector Collaboration ... is at the heart of everything

Rethinking Risk ... focusing on someone's future and not their past

Systems Change ... moving beyond the 'limitations' of the status quo

Added value that our Group brings



- Wheatley property fully furnished customer choice of carpets, sofa etc.;
- Eat Well food for 2 weeks;
- LD1 Fire prevention system visit from Scottish Fire and Rescue & fire retardant starter pack;
- Bank account/valid identification Universal Credit;
- House insurance with accidental damage/ TV licence.

Accessing housing is start of the journey for the customer

Lessons learned



- Flexible Housing Support is crucial for tenancy sustainment – regular customer reviews involving Housing Officers – look at management of cases differently to support tenancy sustainment;
- Tenancy sustainment is high but not without challenges;
- Using our Group expertise to bring Housing and Care closer together;
- Sharing the learning across Group and further afield.

Challenges or opportunities



- No National Performance Management Framework identifying "end to end" or gaps;
- What does good Housing support look like and expectations of support provider & RSL. What to do when things aren't going to plan;
- Non-engagement with the customer no consistency of approach across support providers;
- Reverse pathway what will this look like;
- Mapping of Housing First cases to avoid clustering;
- Empowering language;
- Role of RSLs in the process added value of our Group context.

Outcomes from Housing First

- 81% increase in the number of health appointments
- 3% decrease in missed appointments
- 6 figure savings to the criminal justice service annually
- Average of 7 tenancies prior to HF- after 1.8
- Reduction in offending 65% in year 1
