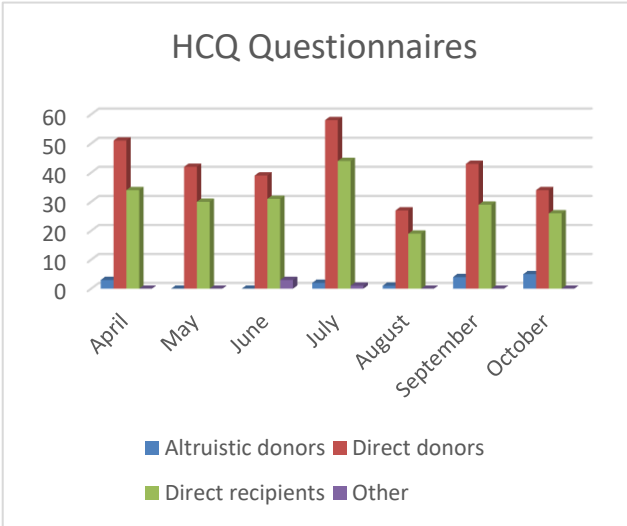
**REACH Transplant**

A short term working group has been formed as a sub group of the Living Donation Scotland Board. The aim of this group is to implement the Donation and Transplant Action Plan 20-21 Priority 4.2 to roll out REACH Transplant to all units in Scotland. This will ensure that all patients suitable for kidney transplantation receive a home visit or direct engagement to discuss transplant options at an early stage.

**Workforce planning**

Increasing the number of living donor transplants in Scotland will require adequate resource to ensure the donor and recipient pathway can be facilitated. As part of the Priority 4.3 work a scoping exercise is underway to establish current resources and produce recommendations for future staffing.
