
Public Sector Employment in Scotland Statistics for 1st Quarter 2020

About this publication

The statistics in this release are based on administrative records and surveys of individual public sector bodies carried out by the Scottish Government and the Office for National Statistics (ONS). This is a snapshot of employment as at March 2020, therefore the data relates to employment prior to the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic in Scotland. The publication includes information on public sector employment in Scotland with distinctions made for employment in devolved bodies and reserved bodies (located in Scotland). The public sector is defined based on UK National Accounts definitions. The statistics in this release were designated National Statistics in December 2009

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Summary

Key points (based on headcount data) include:

- In March 2020 there were 561,900 people employed in the public sector in Scotland, accounting for 21.3% of total employment.
- In March 2020, employment in the public sector was 6,930 more than in March 2019.
- When major reclassifications are excluded, the public sector increased between March 2019 and March 2020 by around 6,000 (1.2%)¹.
- Of the total 561,900 people employed in the public sector in Scotland, 508,700 (90.5%) were employed in the devolved public sector in March 2020, 8,700 (1.7%) more than in March 2019.
- Between March 2019 and March 2020, employment in the devolved public sector increased in Public Corporations by 30 (0.4%), in Local Government by 2,810 (1.1%), Further Education Colleges by 160 (1.1%), Police and Fire Related Services by 470 (1.7%), the NHS by 2,910 (1.8%), and Civil Service by 2,460 (13.1%), and decreased only in Other Public Bodies by 150 (0.9%).
- 53,300 (9.5%) people in the public sector were employed in the reserved public sector in Scotland, 1,770 (3.2%) less than in March 2019.
- Between March 2019 and March 2020, employment within the reserved public sector decreased in Other Public Sector by 800 (3.9%) and the Civil Service by 970 (3.9%) and stayed the same for Armed Forces.

About this publication

Major Reclassifications

The estimates of public and private sector employment published in this quarter's release have been impacted by the reclassification of Scottish Registered Social Landlords, which are included in the private sector from September 2018 but are included in the public sector from September 2001 to June 2018. This reclassification has resulted in around 15,000 employees who were included in the public sector up until June 2018 being included in the private sector estimates for September 2018 onwards.

Background Notes

Statistics prior to Q1 2008 are estimates. These have been calculated using the total UK reserved public sector employment figure and applying to Scotland on a pro-rata basis as regional level data has only been collected from Q1 2008 onwards.


1. Total Employment and Public and Private Sector Employment in Scotland; Headcount (see Table 1)

Public sector employment increased by 6,930 (1.2%) between March 2019 and March 2020, while private sector employment decreased by 1.8%. This increase in public sector employment is mainly due to an increase in the devolved public sector.

The public sector is defined according to the UK National Accounts Classifications Guide.




Chart 1 shows that the number of people employed in the public sector remained relatively constant between Q1 2014 and Q2 2018, before falling in Q3 2018 and rising again from Q4 2018 onwards. Excluding the effects of major reclassifications² (i.e. taking out the headcounts for all large organisations listed in footnote 2 from the overall numbers), the number of people employed in the public sector gradually reached a peak in Q2 2006, decreased to Q3 2013 and remained relatively constant until Q3 2018. The increase between Q3 2018 and Q4 2018 is mainly due to Cordia services moving back under Glasgow City Council services.

Chart 2 shows the annual change in employment for the public sector. Employment rose by 6,930 between Q1 2019 and Q1 2020. The devolved public sector headcount has risen due to increases in local government, NHS and devolved civil service (e.g. inclusion of Social Security Scotland from Q3 2018 and Forestry and Land Scotland and Scottish Forestry from Q2 2019 in Scottish Government Agencies and increases in Scottish Government Core Directorates (see section 5 for more detail).

The annual change in Chart 2 in Q2 2019 shows the effects of Registered Social Landlords being re-classified to the private sector (in Q3 2018), while the large change in Q3 2019 includes the effects of Cordia services moving back under Glasgow City Council Services in Q4 2018.

Impact of Excluding Major Reclassifications from Public Sector

If the major reclassifications² were to be excluded from the public sector series (i.e. the headcounts for all large organisations listed in footnote 2 were taken out of the overall numbers), there would be around 549,000 people employed in the public sector in March 2020. This was 20.8% of the total employment in Scotland compared with 21.3% if major reclassifications are included.

Public sector employment, excluding the effects of the major reclassifications, would be around 6,000 (1.2%) higher in March 2020 compared with March 2019.

Chart 3 below shows that the overall public sector in Scotland increased by 6,930 (1.2%) between March 2019 and March 2020. Chart 3 also shows the estimated impact of removing major reclassifications from the series.




Chart 3: Annual Change (from March 2019 to March 2020) in Public Sector Employment, Headcount

2. Public Sector Employment by Devolved and Reserved Responsibility; Headcount (see Tables 2, 3 and 4)

The devolved public sector headcount was 1.7% higher and the reserved public sector was 3.2% lower in March 2020, compared with March 2019. The Civil Service saw the largest percentage point increase (13.1%) in the devolved sector, while Other Public Bodies had a decrease (0.9%). In the reserved public sector, Other Public Sector and Civil Service each had a decrease of 3.9% compared to March 2019, leading to the overall decrease in headcount in the reserved public sector.

The devolved public sector covers those bodies which are the responsibility of the Scottish Government or Scottish Parliament while the reserved public sector in Scotland covers those bodies for which the UK Government has ministerial responsibility.




Figure 2: Make-up of the Scottish Public Sector as at March 2020, Headcount³

3. Devolved Public Sector Employment in

Scotland; Headcount (see Table 3)

Employment in the devolved public sector was 8,700 (1.7%) higher, at 508,700 in March 2020 compared with 500,000 in March 2019.

The devolved public sector includes:

Devolved Civil Service (see section 5),

Local Government, covering Scottish Local Authorities, Police and Fire Services (up to Q1 2013), Valuation Joint Boards and Regional Transport Partnerships,

Police and Fire Services (Q2 2013 onwards),

NHS in Scotland,


Further Education Colleges,

Devolved Public Corporations,

Other Devolved Public Bodies (which covers Non-Departmental Bodies and other bodies).

Chart 4 shows the size of each group in the devolved public sector as at March 2020.

The increase in the overall headcount over the year in the devolved public sector was due to:

- Employment levels in Scottish Local Government rising by 2,810 (1.1%) to 253,000 in March 2020;
- Employment in the Devolved Civil Service rising by 2,460 (13.1%) to 21,100 in March 2020;
- Employment levels in the NHS rising by 2,910 (1.8%) to 167,000 in March 2020⁴;
- Employment in Further Education Colleges rising by 160 (1.1%) to 14,400 in March 2020.



- The number of Police and Fire Service employees rising by 470 (1.7%) to 28,400 in March 2020.
- Employment in Public Corporations rising by 30 (0.4%) to 8,000 in March 2020;

while:

• Employment in Other Public Bodies fell by 150 (0.9%) to 15,900 in March 2020;

4. Reserved Public Sector Employment in

Scotland; Headcount (see Table 4)


The number of people employed in the reserved public sector in March 2020 was 53,300, 1,770 (3.2%) lower than in March 2019.

The reserved public sector employment includes:

- Reserved Civil Service (see section 5);
- Armed Forces;
- Other Public Sector (which covers Public Sector Financial Institutions, Non-Departmental Bodies and Other Bodies).

Chart 5 shows the size of each group in the reserved public sector as at March 2020.

The reserved civil service employs the largest proportion of employees in the reserved public sector.



- Employment levels for Other Public Sector⁵ falling by 800 (3.9%) from 20,400 in March 2019 to 19,600 in March 2020;
- Employment levels for the Reserved Civil Service falling by 970 (3.9%) to 24,000;

while:

• Employment levels for the Armed Forces were unchanged at 9,700.

Reserved Civil Service and Other Public Sector both decreased by 3.9%.

5. Civil Service Employment in Scotland; Headcount (see Tables 5 and 6)

This section provides a summary of the civil service in Scotland.

In March 2020, there were 45,100 people employed as civil servants in Scotland. This is made up of 21,100 (46.9%) people working in the Devolved Civil Service and 24,000 (53.1%) working in UK government departments. The total number of civil servants has increased by 1,480 (3.4%) between March 2019 and March 2020.

The devolved civil service is made up of:

- Scottish Government Core Departments
- Scottish Government Agencies
- Crown Office and Procurator Fiscal Service
- Non-Ministerial Departments

The reserved civil service is made up of:


- UK Government Departments
- Scotland Office

Devolved Civil Service

The Devolved Civil Service has 2,460 (13.1%) more people employed since March 2019.

Chart 6 shows a breakdown of the Devolved Civil Service in Scotland as of March 2020⁶.

Scottish Government Core

In March 2020, there were 7,400 people employed in Scottish Government (SG) Core Directorates, which is 34.8% of the devolved civil service in Scotland. Employment in SG Core Directorates was 680 (10.2%) higher in March 2020, compared with March 2019. This rise in employment is mainly due to the devolution of powers from the UK Government to the Scottish Government⁷.

Scottish Government Agencies⁸

There were 8,000 people employed in Scottish Government Agencies in March 2020. Employment in SG Agencies increased by 1,450 (22.2%) compared with March 2019.

Non Ministerial Departments

Non Ministerial Departments (NMD) include National Records of Scotland, Registers of Scotland, Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator, Scottish Courts and Tribunals Service, Scottish Housing Regulator (from April 2012), Revenue Scotland (from January 2015), Food Standards Scotland (from April 2015) and Scottish Fiscal Commission (from September 2017). In March 2020, there were 3,800 people employed in these NMDs. This was 200 (5.5%) more than in March 2019.

Crown Office & Procurator Fiscal

In March 2020, there were 2,000 people employed in the Crown Office & Procurator Fiscal, an increase of 130 (6.9%) since March 2019.



Reserved Civil Service

Employment in the Reserved Civil Service was 970 (3.9%) lower than in March 2019, decreasing from 25,000 in March 2019 to 24,000 in March 2020.

Chart 7 identifies the breakdown of headcount employment in UK government departments as at March 2020.

Department for Work and Pensions

In March 2020, there were 8,300 people employed in the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP). Employment in DWP was 650 (7.3%) lower in March 2020, compared with March 2019.

HM Revenue and Customs

There were 7,800 people employed in HM Revenue and Customs in March 2020, 310 (3.8%) lower than March 2019.

Ministry of Defence

There were 4,100 people employed in the Ministry of Defence in March 2020, 0.8% lower than March 2019.

Other Civil Service⁹

The number of people employed in Other Reserved Civil Service in March 2020 was 20 (0.6%) lower at 2,800 people.

Department for International Development

The number of people employed in the Department for International Development in March 2020 was 900, 30 (3.5%) higher than March 2019.

Scotland Office

In March 2020, there were 90 people employed in the Scotland Office, an increase of 2.2% since March 2019.
