Definitions

Day care of children: Childcare provided to infants and toddlers, pre-schoolers and school-aged children in a centre-based facility, such as a nursery, playgroup or afterschool club.

Early Learning and Childcare (ELC): ELC services are a subset of day care of children services that receive Scottish Government funding to provide 600 hours of funded ELC per year to children before they go onto primary school. All children are entitled to funded ELC the term after their 3rd birthday, and some two-year-olds are also eligible. However, ELC services also provide childcare to infants and toddlers before they are entitled to funding, and parents can also pay to 'top up' their funded hours. ELC is provided by local authority settings, and private and voluntary providers working in partnership with local authorities. Annual entitlement will rise from 600 to 1,140 hours from August as part of the Scottish Government's <u>ELC expansion</u>.

Childminding: Childcare provided in a domestic setting, rather than the 'formal setting' provision of day care of children. A minority of childminders provide funded ELC: 16% are approved to provide funded ELC for two-year-olds and 13% are approved to provide funded ELC for three- and four-year-olds, and a smaller proportion are currently delivering funded ELC (see the latest Scottish Childminding Association audit <u>here</u>:

Children by age

Funded ELC uptake dropped across all age groups between 2019 and 2020 but the number of deferral registrations and proportion of deferral uptake rose slightly. The overall decrease in the uptake of funded ELC this year may be due to the effects of COVID-19, with some parents choosing not to register their children.








The 10th decile (i.e. the least deprived areas) has the highest proportion of children registered for childcare.




Children in less deprived areas are consistently more likely to be registered with childminding services than children in more deprived areas.




Children in more deprived areas are consistently more likely to be registered with Children and Family Centres than children in less deprived areas.

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




There has been a relative decline in childminding services over the past three years, but they are consistently more likely to be found in the least deprived areas.
