As at 4th October 2020:






- There have been 1154 children and young people aged 2-17 years in Scotland who have tested positive for COVID-19 since the start of the outbreak.

In the week ending 4th October 2020:

- There were 97 children and young people aged 2-17 years in Scotland who tested positive for COVID-19, among the 1,798 children and young people who were tested.
- The identified COVID-19 positive cases reflected a rate of 5.4 cases per 100,000 2-4 year olds, 9.0 cases per 100,000 5-11 year olds and 83.2 cases per 100,000 12-17 year olds.

On 6th October:

- Attendance in local authority schools was 91.8%, whilst the percentages of openings recorded as pupils not in school (non Covid-19 reasons) was 5.7%, and for not in school (Covid-19 related reasons) was 2.5%.
- 16,108 pupils were not in school either all or part of the day because of Covid-19 related reasons.
- 1,616 staff were absent due to Covid-19 related reasons, of which, 984 were teaching staff and 632 were other school-based staff. Note that this week's figures do not include Angus, Argyll & Bute, Dundee City and Perth and Kinross due to school holidays – figures from previous weeks have not been adjusted.

- 70,539 children were attending a childcare setting and 1,318 had a Covid-19 related absence.
- 430 (2.4%) childcare staff were absent due to Covid-19 related reasons [based on a 48% response rate].
