

# Covid-19 Education Recovery Group - Infographic

As at 11th October 2020:

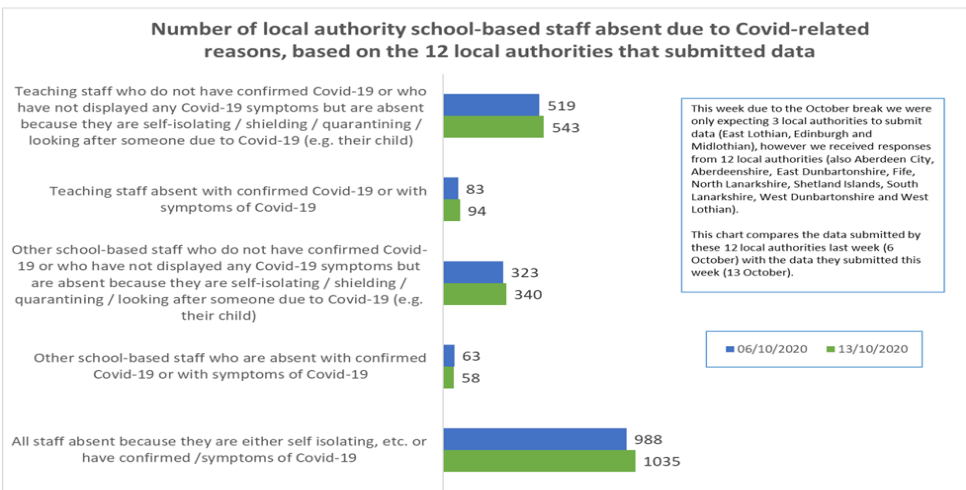
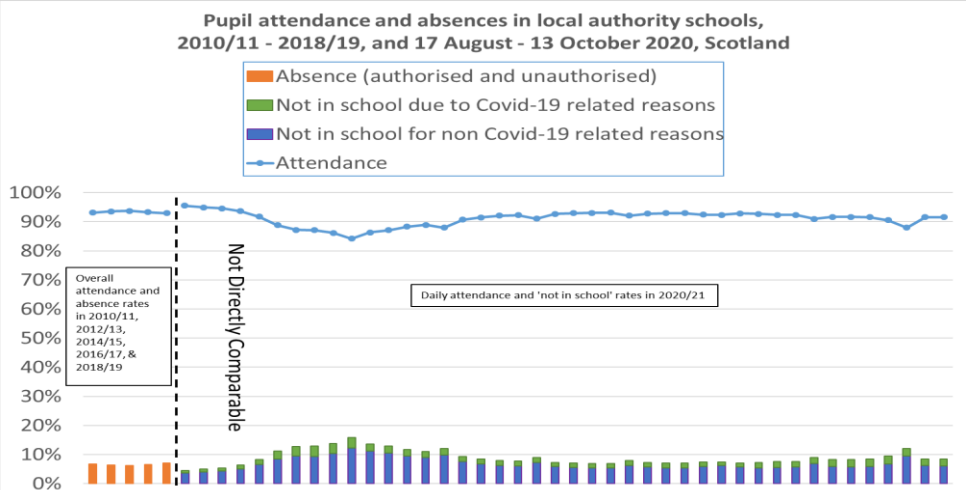
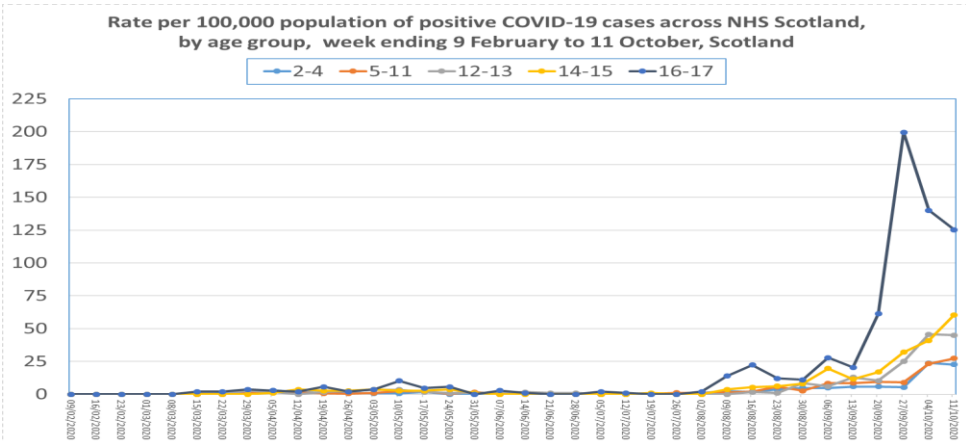
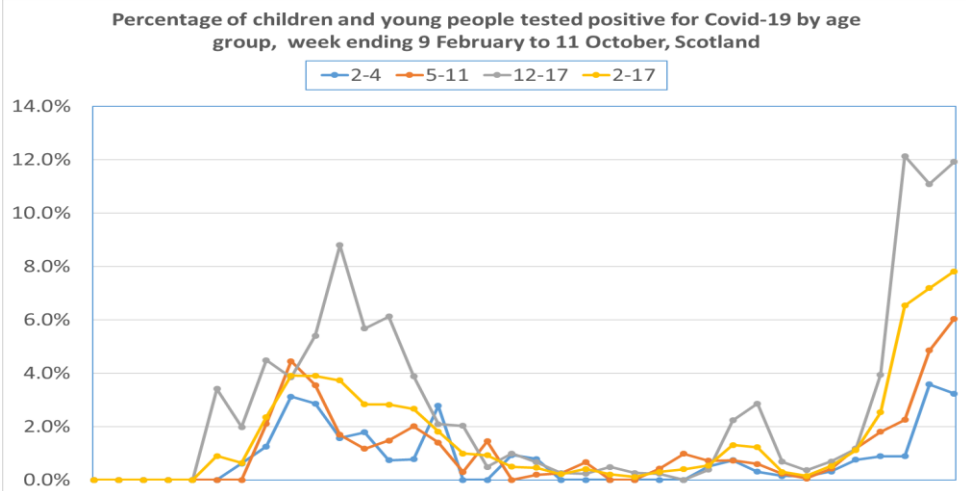
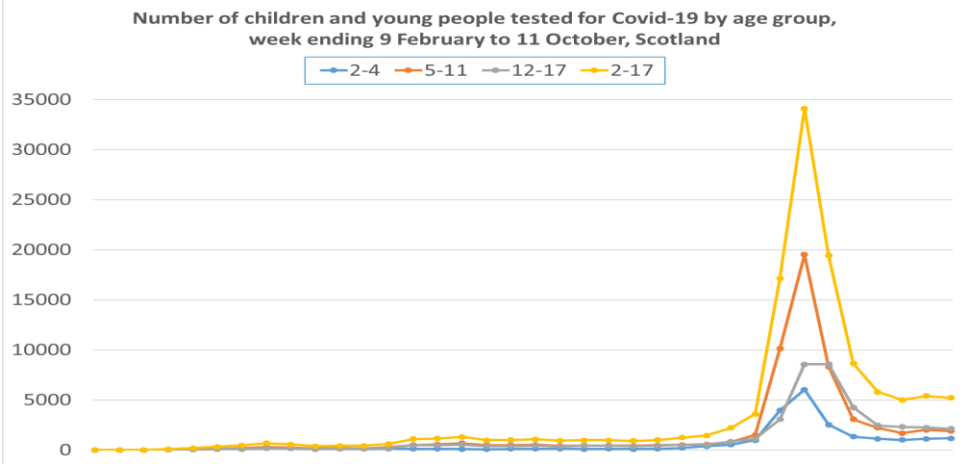
- There have been 1,853 children and young people aged 2-17 years in Scotland who have tested positive for COVID-19 since the start of the outbreak.

In the week ending 11<sup>th</sup> October 2020:

- There were 408 children and young people aged 2-17 years in Scotland who tested positive for COVID-19, among the 5,218 children and young people who were tested.
- The identified COVID-19 positive cases reflected a rate of 22.6 cases per 100,000 2-4 year olds, 27.3 cases per 100,000 5-11 year olds, 44.9 per 100,000 12-13 year olds, 60.4 per 100,000 14-15 year olds and 125.3 cases per 100,000 16-17 year olds.

On 13<sup>th</sup> October:

- Attendance in local authority schools was 91.6%, whilst the percentages of openings recorded as pupils not in school (non Covid-19 reasons) was 6.0%, and for not in school (Covid-19 related reasons) was 2.4%.
- 1,959 pupils were not in school either all or part of the day because of Covid-19 related reasons. Note that 29/32 local authorities are on holiday this week.
- 1,035 staff were absent due to Covid-19 related reasons, of which, 637 were teaching staff and 398 were other school-based staff. Note that this week's figures are based on 12 local authorities. Twenty local authorities did not submit figures due to the school holidays.

- 29,006 children were attending a childcare setting and 790 had a Covid-19 related absence (figures lower than usual due to October break).
- 466 (3.5%) childcare staff were absent due to Covid-19 related reasons [based on a 30% response rate].
