As at 11th October 2020:






- There have been 1,973 children and young people aged 2-17 years in Scotland who have tested positive for COVID-19 since the start of the outbreak.

In the week ending 11th October 2020:

- There were 527 children and young people aged 2-17 years in Scotland who tested positive for COVID-19, among the 6,194 children and young people who were tested.
- The identified COVID-19 positive cases reflected a rate of 26.8 cases per 100,000 2-4 year olds, 36.8 cases per 100,000 5-11 year olds, 54.4 per 100,000 12-13 year olds, 78.2 per 100,000 14-15 year olds and 163.3 cases per 100,000 of the general population was 124.3.

On 20th October:

- Attendance in local authority schools was 91.9%, whilst the percentages of openings recorded as pupils not in school (non Covid-19 reasons) was 5.5%, and for not in school (Covid-19 related reasons) was 2.6%.
- 9,823 pupils were not in school either all or part of the day because of Covid-19 related reasons. Note that 16/32 local authorities are still off for the October break.
- 1,571 staff were absent due to Covid-19 related reasons, of which, 938 were teaching staff and 633 were other school-based staff. Note that this week's figures are based on 21 local authorities.

- 50,076 children were attending a childcare setting and 1,430 had a Covid-19 related absence (figures lower than usual due to October break).
- 624 (4.1%) childcare staff were absent due to Covid-19 related reasons [based on a 35% response rate].
