As at 25th October 2020:

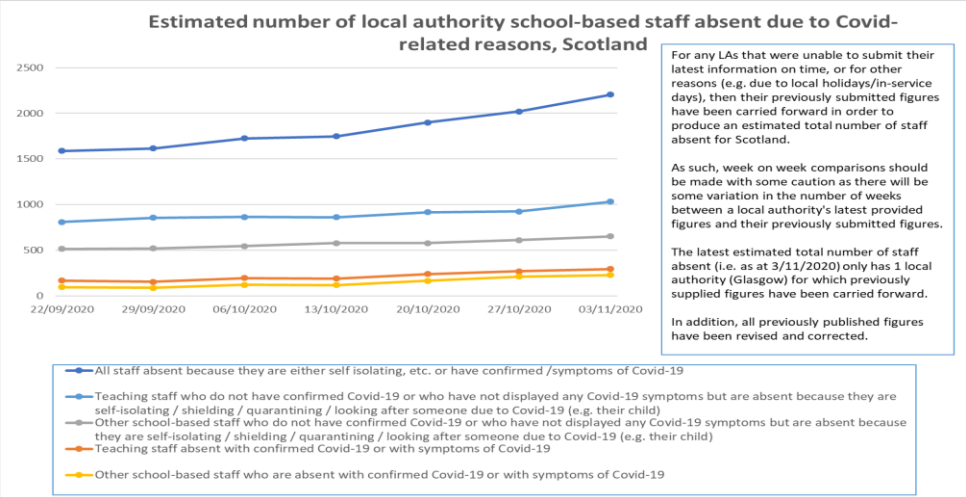
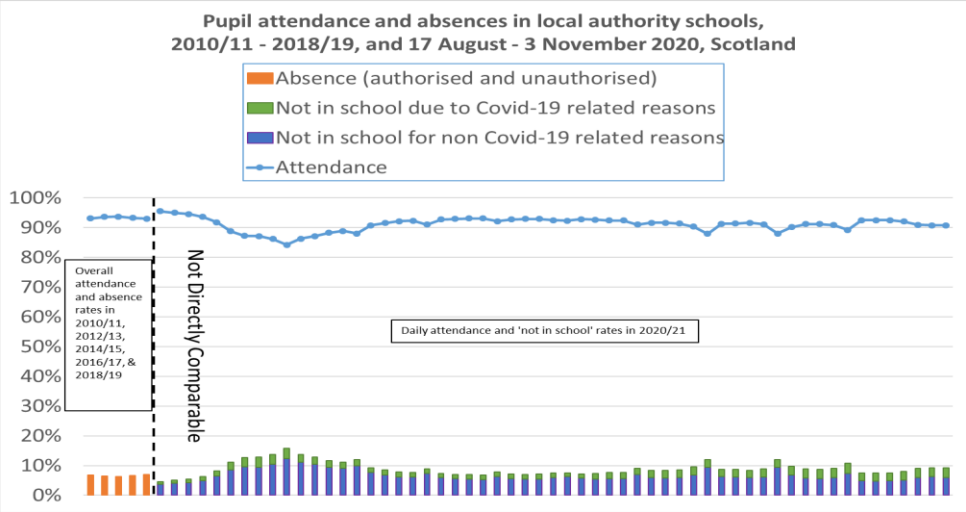
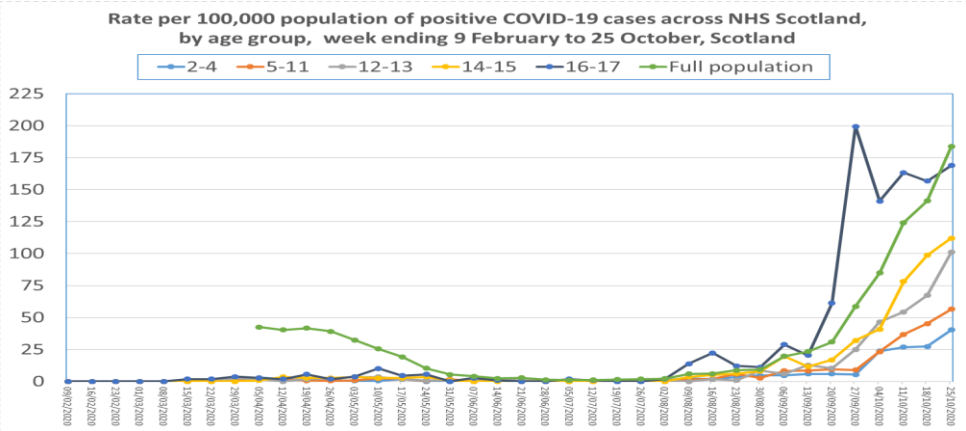
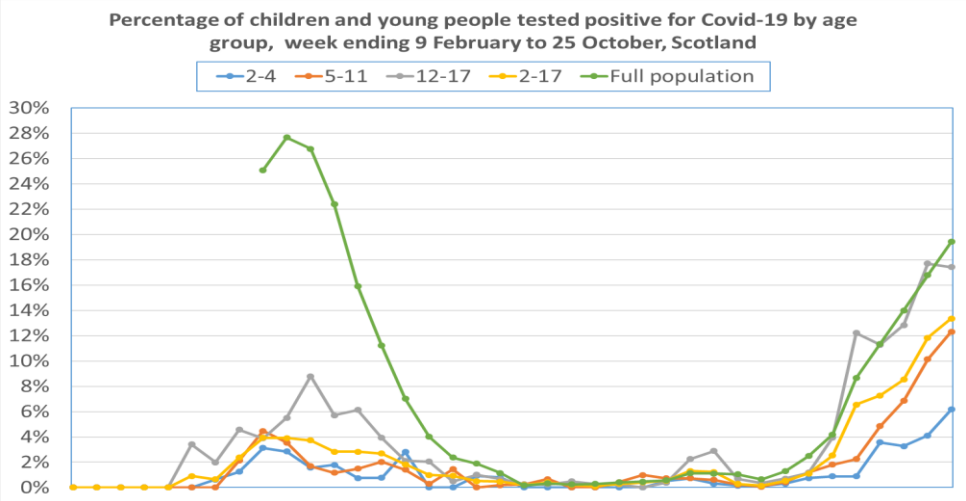
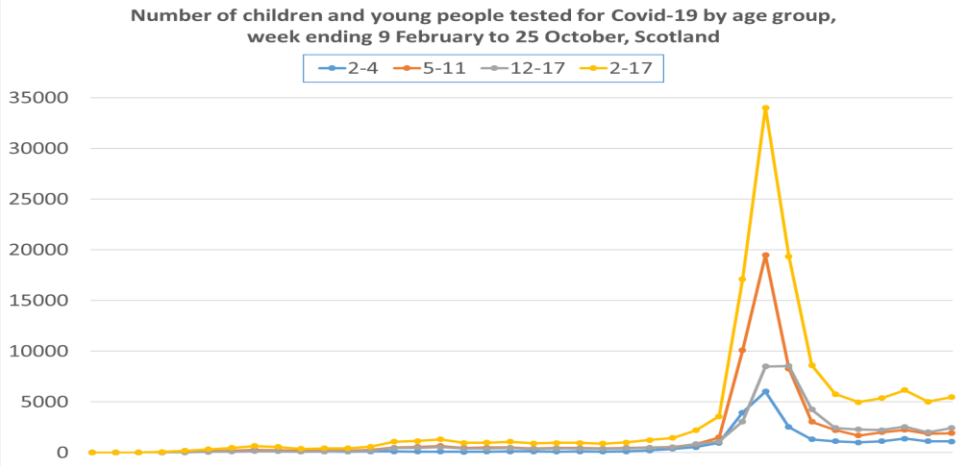
- There have been 3,302 children and young people aged 2-17 years in Scotland who have tested positive for COVID-19 since the start of the outbreak.

In the week ending 25th October 2020:

- There were 731 children and young people aged 2-17 years in Scotland who tested positive for COVID-19, among the 5,473 children and young people who were tested.
- The identified COVID-19 positive cases reflected a rate of 40.4 cases per 100,000 2-4 year olds, 56.5 cases per 100,000 5-11 year olds, 101.0 per 100,000 12-13 year olds, 112.0 per 100,000 14-15 year olds and 168.9 cases per 100,000 16-17 year olds. The rate of cases per 100,000 of the general population was 183.7.

On 3rd November:

- Attendance in local authority schools was 90.8%, whilst the percentages of openings recorded as pupils not in school (non Covid-19 reasons) was 6.0%, and for not in school (Covid-19 related reasons) was 3.2%.
- 23,034 pupils were not in school either all or part of the day because of Covid-19 related reasons.
- 2,206 staff were absent due to Covid-19 related reasons, of which, 1,326 were teaching staff and 880 were other school-based staff.

- 77,508 children were attending a childcare setting and 2,237 had a Covid-19 related absence.
- 731 (3.8%) childcare staff were absent due to Covid-19 related reasons [based on a 51% response rate].
